P: *Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth;* **C: break forth into joyous song and sing praises!**





FIRST READING

Acts 11:1-18

Now the apostles and the brothers who were throughout Judea heard that the Gentiles also had received the word of God. So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcision party criticized him, saying, "You went to uncircumcised men and ate with them." But Peter began and explained it to them in order: "I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision, something like a great sheet descending, being let down from heaven by its four corners, and it came down to me. Looking at it closely, I observed animals and beasts of prey and reptiles and birds of the air. And I heard a voice saying to me, 'Rise, Peter; kill and eat.' But I said, 'By no means, Lord; for nothing common or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' But the voice answered a second time from heaven, 'What God has made clean, do not call common.'

This happened three times, and all was drawn up again into heaven. And behold, at that very moment three men arrived at the house in which we were, sent to me from Caesarea. And the Spirit told me to go with them, making no distinction. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. And he told us how he had seen the angel stand in his house and say, 'Send to Joppa and bring Simon who is called Peter; he will declare to you a message by which you will be saved, you and all your household.' As I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell on them just as on us at the beginning.

And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he said, 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' If then God gave the same gift to them as he gave to us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could stand in God's way?" When they heard these things they fell silent. And they glorified God, saying, "Then to the Gentiles also God has granted repentance that leads to life."

SECOND READING

Revelation 21:1-7

Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. And I saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband.


And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God. He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away."

And he who was seated on the throne said, "Behold, I am making all things new." Also he said, "Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true."

And he said to me, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty I will give from the spring of the water of life without payment. The one who conquers will have this heritage, and I will be his God and he will be my son.

L: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God.



When Jesus had spoken these words, he lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, "Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son that the Son may glorify you, since you have given him authority over all flesh, to give eternal life to all whom you have given him. And this is eternal life, that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent. I glorified you on earth, having accomplished the work that you gave me to do. And now, Father, glorify me in your own presence with the glory that I had with you before the world existed.

"I have manifested your name to the people whom you gave me out of the world. Yours they were, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything that you have given me is from you. For I have given them the words that you gave me, and they have received them and have come to know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me. I am praying for them. I am not praying for the world but for those whom you have given me, for they are yours. All mine are yours, and yours are mine, and I am glorified in them. And I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, keep them in your name, which you have given me, that they may be one, even as we are one. While I was with them, I kept them in your name, which you have given me. I have guarded them, and not one of them has been lost except the son of destruction, that the Scripture might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves. I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. I do not ask that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one. They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. And for their sake I consecrate myself, that they also may be sanctified in truth.

"I do not ask for these only, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. The glory that you have given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me. Father, I desire that they also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see my glory that you have given me because you loved me before the foundation of the world. O righteous Father, even though the world does not know you, I know you, and these know that you have sent me. I made known to them your name, and I will continue to make it known, that the love with which you have loved me may be in them, and I in them."

P: This is the Gospel of the Lord.



THE NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.








PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

bless-ed is He, bless-ed is He that cometh in the name of the Lord.





THE LORD'S PRAYER

"Hear us Father When We Pray"





VERTICAL CONNECTIONS: – is the series we enter into this weekend. Imagine the two most important relationships in your life. The first one, is your relationship with God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This one is the relationship that should drive all the others. If this relationship is healthy and strong, all your other relationships will find themselves in proper perspective. If this relationship is unhealthy or weak, all your other relationships will be troubled as well. God's best for us includes being in close relationship to the One who made us, in His image, the One who redeemed us by His shed blood, and the One who gives us the gift of faith, and dwells in us daily. This VERTICAL CONNECTION is enhanced by an active and intentional communication with God in prayer. **beginnings** – launches us into this series where we will examine the current state of our vertical connections, or prayer life with God.

- What does your prayer life look like today? (This evaluation is for you only)
 - My prayer life could be better.
 - I pray daily for everything.
 - o It seems like God never answers my prayers.
 - I listen often for God's answer to my prayers.
 - My vertical connection to God is constant and ongoing.
 - o I have never prayed.
 - I enjoy hearing other people pray.
 - The Lord's Prayer helps me draw closer to Christ Jesus.
 - I pray before meals at home.
 - My prayer life used to be more fulfilling.
 - o I pray daily for meals even when I am at a restaurant.
 - Listening for God's response has been a part of my prayer life.
 - I often wonder why God answers my prayers in the way that He does.
 - Watching and waiting for His response is common for me.

- I always tell others that I will pray for them. Sometimes I do, sometimes not so much.
- I easily pray with others.
- My prayer connection to God is easy and unforced, He is my Friend.
- I struggle to pray.
- Prayer is hard for me.
- Other people seem to pray so beautifully, my prayers seem weak and clumsy.
- o I just never know what to say in a prayer.
- When asked to pray out loud with people, I pass.
- o I have never prayed out loud with others.
- My daily life often does not include prayer.
- Today, my prayer life is the best it's ever been.
- o I can't remember the last time I prayed.
- It seems like God has stopped listening, so I do not pray.
- Because of all He has promised and already done for me, I pray prayers of thanksgiving and praise to Him continually.
- When I pray, I feel like a beggar on the street, unsure what, if any answer my prayer will bring.
- When I pray, because of His promises, I know that I will receive His best answer to my prayer, and I move forward knowing He has already answered, eager to discover what His answer is.
- Through this series, I would like to grow closer to God and connect better with Him through prayer.

NOTES FROM PASTOR GALLIGAR

- Have you been curious? What does Pastor do all week? Surely it doesn't take 6 days to get ready for an hour on Saturday and Sunday. An average week includes; meetings with members for communion, prayer, counseling, meetings with the council and the boards, private devotions and prayer time, hospital visits for prayer before surgery or after, many, many phone calls, planning and preparing services and bulletins, preparing a message for worship (this can take up to 12-15 hours/week), repenting and asking God for His forgiveness, helping people walk through life with Christ, responding to emails, cards, letters, etc., and many other things. If you would like to spend a day with me and walk through the daily routines, I would welcome the company
- Did you know that Faith Lutheran Church has been committed to giving 10% of our annual offerings to mission work outside the walls of our church? This has been a part of the DNA of Faith for many years now. Five percent of our annual offerings are

given in support of our Synod, District, and seminaries. And the other 5% has been used to support local missions in and around Citrus County.

We are so happy you are with us today at church. And we want you to feel at home here at Faith. If you need anything, tell your mom or dad, or grandma or grandpa, or whoever you came with, and they can let us know and we can help.

- Please relax and enjoy your time here. Jesus knows that little ones wiggle and squeak sometimes, and it is a joy to His ears, and ours as well.
- Encourage your parents to help you sit up front by the altar area. That way you'll be better able to see all the stuff that is going on. Most of the action happens up front.
- Be sure to grab an activity bag from the kid's room in the back of the church. (It's that place with the window that looks into the church.)
- Be sure to sing along with your parents and the people around you.
 Jesus loves it when we make joyful noises to Him.
- When we pray, a lot of times we fold our hands and bow our heads so we can listen better to the prayers. Don't you love it when we pray together?
- Jesus teaches us a special prayer called the "Our Father", or the "Lord's Prayer". When we pray this one, it's a good time to hold our parent's hand because this is a prayer we pray together.

Please know that while you are caring for your parents, the rest of us will be rejoicing in Jesus' words, *"Let the little children come to Me and do not hinder them, for the Kingdom of God belongs to such as these."* (Luke 18:16) You are a gift to the church, so we will do our best to welcome, smile, encourage, help, and bless you all.

The Bible is alive, it speaks to me; it has feet, it runs after me; it has hands, it lays hold of me.

As is the business of tailors to make clothes and cobblers to make shoes, so it is the business of Christians to pray.

To gather with God's people in united adoration of the Father is as necessary to the Christian life as prayer.

The less I pray, the harder it gets; the more I pray, the better it goes.

If I fail to spend two hours in prayer each morning, the devil gets the victory through the day. I have too much business I cannot get on without spending three hours daily in prayer.

No one can believe how powerful prayer is and what it can effect, except those who have learned it by experience. Whenever I have prayed earnestly, I have been heard and have obtained more than I prayed for. God sometimes delays, but He always comes.

Prayer is a strong wall and fortress of the church; it is a goodly Christian weapon.

Grant that I may not pray alone with the mouth; help me that I may pray from the depths of my heart.

God wants us to pray, and he wants to hear our prayers-not because we are worthy, but because he is merciful.

We cannot attain to the understanding of Scripture either by study or by the intellect. Your first duty is to begin by prayer. Entreat the Lord to grant you, of His great mercy, the true understanding of His Word. There is no other interpreter of the Word of God than the Author of this Word, as He Himself has said, "They shall be all taught of God" (John 6:45). Hope for nothing from your own labors, from your own understanding: trust solely in God, and in the influence of His Spirit. Believe this on the word of a man who has experience.
