L: *This is the Word of the Lord*. **C: Thanks be to God**.



HOLY GOSPEL

Luke 8:26-39

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the eighth chapter.



Then they sailed to the country of the Gerasenes, which is opposite Galilee. When Jesus had stepped out on land, there met him a man from the city who had demons. For a long time he had worn no clothes, and he had not lived in a house but among the tombs. When he saw Jesus, he cried out and fell down before him and said with a loud voice, "What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you, do not torment me." For he had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. (For many a time it had seized him. He was kept under guard and bound with chains and shackles, but he would break the bonds and be driven by the demon into the desert.) Jesus then asked him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Legion," for many demons had entered him. And they begged him not to command them to depart into the abyss. Now a large herd of pigs was feeding there on the hillside, and they begged him to let them enter these. So he

gave them permission. Then the demons came out of the man and entered the pigs, and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the lake and were drowned.

When the herdsmen saw what had happened, they fled and told it in the city and in the country. Then people went out to see what had happened, and they came to Jesus and found the man from whom the demons had gone, sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind, and they were afraid. And those who had seen it told them how the demon-possessed man had been healed. Then all the people of the surrounding country of the Gerasenes asked him to depart from them, for they were seized with great fear. So he got into the boat and returned. The man from whom the demons had gone begged that he might be with him, but Jesus sent him away, saying, "Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you." And he went away, proclaiming throughout the whole city how much Jesus had done for him.



THE P.R.A.Y. MODEL: A SIMPLE FRAMEWORK FOR PRAYER

Sometimes we complicate things that God has made very simple. Easy examples of how to communicate with God are found in the first pages of our bible in Genesis, and in most of the pages of the first four books of the New Testament, called the gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. In Genesis, we find God speaking to Adam and Eve just as a father might talk with his son. Simple conversations, easy words, nothing complicated about it. In the gospels, the disciples are always talking to Jesus, and when they do, they ask Him questions, just like you would ask a friend, a teacher, or someone you thought would have an answer to something you wanted to know. And their questions are asked in plain language, simple words, nothing fancy, just straightforward speaking to Jesus, who is God.

All of this is called "prayer". It is our Vertical Connection to God. To help us strengthen this connection, here is a simple framework to use as a starting point, the P.R.A.Y. Model.

PRAISE - God is worthy to be praised. Prayer should begin with genuine praise towards God. Prayers of praise involve thanking God for who He is and what He's done. As you spend time praising God, reflect on His character and the good gifts that He has given you. **REPENT** - Repentance is the act of turning away from sin and turning toward God. Since we as humans have a sinful, fallen nature, we should have a continuous attitude of repentance. During this portion of your prayer time, confess specific sins that you can think of to God and repent of them. He already knows about all this stuff but still calls you to confess.

ASK - Spend the next portion of your prayer time asking God to work. God wants us to humbly ask Him for what we need and want. Asking Him means admitting we can't do these things on our own.

YIELD - The final portion of your prayer time when you're following the P.R.A.Y. model will be spent sitting quietly before God and listening to what He tells you. As you listen to what He tells you, commit to being obedient to whatever next step he may call you to take. Those who have committed to following Jesus through repenting of their sin and placing their trust in Jesus have been given the Holy Spirit. The Spirit helps us in our weaknesses. He gives us both the desire and the power to yield to Jesus' calling even when it is uncomfortable.

Kid's Corner — Where Faith is Fun!

A When we pray, we sometimes fold our hands and bow our heads to help us focus. We love praying together as a church family.

The Lord's Prayer is a special one we say together. You can hold your parent's hand and pray with us—Jesus loves it when His people pray as one.

And while you're helping your grown-ups worship, we'll be celebrating Jesus' words: "Let the little children come to Me... for the Kingdom of God belongs to such as these." (Luke 18:16)

You are a gift to this church—and we are so thankful for you!

PRAYER CHAIN

Prayer is powerful—whether spoken privately in our hearts or together as the Body of Christ.

- **Private prayer** draws us closer to God, developing our *Vertical Connection* with Him through the Holy Spirit.
- **Corporate prayer**, when we lift up needs together as a church, builds unity—the very thing Jesus prayed for among His followers.

At Faith, our **Prayer Chain** is a way to support one another and our wider community through intentional, Spirit-led intercession. When you sign up, you'll receive email prayer requests—sometimes public, sometimes private.

Two types of prayer requests:

1. Public Prayers

These can be freely shared, discussed, or followed up with encouragement (cards, texts, etc.). Please lift these up as soon as you receive them.

2. Private Prayers

Marked clearly in the email subject line. These should be treated with care and confidentiality—shared only with God in prayer, not with others, including the person being prayed for.

If you'd like to join the Prayer Chain (or continue participating), please add your **name and email address** below. Even if you're already receiving emails, we ask that you reaffirm your commitment:
