AS WE GATHER

A disciple of Jesus Christ will *bear his own cross* (Luke 14:27) and follow the Lord through death into life. Discipleship is costly because it crucifies the old self with "all that he has" (Luke 14:33) in order to raise up the new life in Christ.

Jesus calls His disciples to put Him above all - family, possessions and even their own lives (Luke 14:26). This way of the cross is impossible on our own, but Christ has already paid the cost. His cross is set before us as both a choice and a gift: *See, I have set before you today life and good, death and evil* (Deut. 30:15).

Taking up His cross is to choose life, that you and your offspring may live, loving the Lord your God, obeying his voice and holding fast to him (Deut. 30:19–20). To live that life in Christ is also to bear His cross in love, The place in which they were gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and continued to speak the word of God with boldness. (Acts 4:31b).





SECOND READING

And when they had further threatened them, they let them go, finding no way to punish them, because of the people, for all were praising God for what had happened. For the man on whom this sign of healing was performed was more than forty years old.

When they were released, they went to their friends and reported what the chief priests and the elders had said to them. And when they heard it, they lifted their voices together to God and said, "Sovereign Lord, who made the heaven and the earth and the sea and everything in them, who through the mouth of our father David, your servant, said by the Holy Spirit, "'Why did the Gentiles rage, and the peoples plot in vain? The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers were

gathered together, against the Lord and against his Anointed' - for truly in this city there were gathered together against your holy servant Jesus, whom you anointed, both Herod and Pontius Pilate, along with the Gentiles and the peoples of Israel, to do whatever your hand and your plan had predestined to take place. And now, Lord, look upon their threats and grant to your servants to continue to speak your word with all boldness, while you stretch out your hand to heal, and signs and wonders are performed through the name of your holy servant Jesus." And when they had prayed, the place in which they were gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and continued to speak the word of God with boldness. Now the full number of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one said that any of the things that belonged to him was his own, but they had everything in common. And with great power the apostles were giving their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all. There was not a needy person among them, for as many as were owners of lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold and laid it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to each as any had need. Thus Joseph, who was also called by the apostles Barnabas (which means son of encouragement), a Levite, a native of Cyprus, sold a field that belonged to him and brought the money and laid it at the apostles' feet.



HOLY GOSPEL Luke 14:25-35


P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the fourteenth chapter.



Now great crowds accompanied [Jesus], and he turned and said to them, "If anyone comes to me and does not hate his own father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not bear his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. For which of you, desiring to build a tower, does not first sit down and count the cost, whether he has enough to complete it? Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it begin to mock him, saying, 'This man began to build and was not able to finish.' Or what king, going out to encounter another king in war, will not sit down first and deliberate whether he is able with ten thousand to meet him who comes against him with twenty thousand? And if not, while the other is yet a great way off, he sends a delegation and asks for terms of peace. So therefore, any one of you who does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple.

"Salt is good, but if salt has lost its taste, how shall its saltiness be restored? It is of no use either for the soil or for the manure pile. It is thrown away. He who has ears to hear, let him hear."







FOLLOWING JESUS, NO MATTER WHAT!

The Story: Jesus told His followers that being His disciple isn't always easy. He said that to follow Him, people must love Him more than anything else - even more than their family or their own lives. He also said a disciple must "carry their own cross" to follow Him. That means being ready to give up what's most important to us so that Jesus comes first.

That sounds really hard! But Jesus was showing us the truth: following Him costs something. We can't keep one foot in the world and one foot with Jesus - we need to give Him our whole heart.

Peter and John showed what this looks like. When the leaders told them to stop talking about Jesus, they didn't give up. They kept sharing the Good News, even when it meant being arrested or threatened. They knew Jesus had already given everything for them on the cross, so they wanted to give their lives to Him completely.

<u>DID YOU KNOW</u>? When Jesus said, "Carry your cross," He meant that following Him would be hard at times. But He also promised that He would be with us every step of the way.


TRY THIS! Jesus said, "Whoever does not bear his own cross and come after Me cannot be My disciple." (Luke 14:27)

That sounds hard, doesn't it? But Jesus wasn't saying we have to carry a heavy wooden cross like He did. Instead, He meant that following Him means putting Him first - even when it costs us something. This week, think about ways you can "carry your cross" for Jesus:

- Putting Jesus before video games, TV or phone time by stopping to pray or read the Bible.
- Choosing kindness when you feel like being mean.
- Sharing with a friend or sibling, even when you'd rather keep it all to yourself.
- Standing up for what's right, even if others laugh at you.
- Saying "I'm sorry" when you've done something wrong.
- Inviting a friend to church or Sunday School.

- The On the cross below, write or draw one way you can put Jesus first this week.
 - Use words, pictures or even symbols to show your choice.
 - Then, color and decorate the cross to make it your own reminder.
 - Hang it on your fridge, put it by your bed or carry it in your Bible so you remember: "I will follow Jesus, no matter what!"

When we make small choices to put Jesus first, we are carrying our cross and showing Him our love. And we can do it with joy, because Jesus already carried the heaviest cross for us - when He gave His life on Calvary.
