P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the fourth chapter.





And in the synagogue there was a man who had the spirit of an unclean demon, and he cried out with a loud voice, "Ha! What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who

you are—the Holy One of God." But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be silent and come out of him!" And when the demon had thrown him down in their midst, he came out of him, having done him no harm. And they were all amazed and said to one another, "What is this word? For with authority and power he commands the unclean spirits, and they come out!" And reports about him went out into every place in the surrounding region.

And he arose and left the synagogue and entered Simon's house. Now Simon's mother-in-law was ill with a high fever, and they appealed to him on her behalf. And he stood over her and rebuked the fever, and it left her, and immediately she rose and began to serve them.

Now when the sun was setting, all those who had any who were sick with various diseases brought them to him, and he laid his hands on every one of them and healed them. And demons also came out of many, crying, "You are the Son of God!" But he rebuked them and would not allow them to speak, because they knew that he was the Christ.



P: Lord, remember us in Your kingdom and teach us to pray:







Last Tuesday – Core Values – define "what and who we are". They guide us in making decisions, planning strategically, and carrying out the mission of the church. Core values guide the next generation so that what and who we are continues.

Active Core Values define those things that are already present in the church, supported by ministries and events already in progress. The following have been identified and adopted as Faith's Active Core Values: Hospitality, Christ-centered Worship, Lutheran Doctrine, Prayer, Missions, and Outreach.

Those things that are important to the congregation, but not yet being supported by ministries or events within the church are called <u>Aspirational Core</u> <u>Values</u>. These define values we hold or desire, but are not yet practicing. Aspirational Core Values identified and adopted are: *Youth Ministry & Education*, *Witness(Evangelism)*, *Stewardship*, *Sanctity of Human Life*, and Human Care/Mercy Work.
