



did to the prophets.


"But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation.


holy Christian and apostolic Church, I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins, and I look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.


WORDS OF OUR LORD

<u>A SEASON OF HOPE: A Glimpse Beyond</u> – is the message for this weekend. Last Tuesday – The Mission Statement – the mission statement of every organization is a critical piece of the puzzle for the current generation. It guides the church in its efforts. It tells the members and the community what the congregation is about, and the work that the church is going to engage in.

We could easily share the Great Commission of the Church as it was given to us by Jesus in Matthew 28. He told His disciples, and through them, each one of us, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them and teaching them.

We could also take the Greatest Commandment that is given by Jesus in Matthew 22 and turn that into a mission statement for Faith Lutheran Church. He told everyone to love the Lord Your God, and to love our neighbors as ourselves.

But both of these things are a part of the DNA of ALL Churches where the one true God is worshipped. What a mission statement does for Faith is to narrow these two things down into something that is specific to our community and congregation, something that is inline with our context of ministry, and something the helps focus our efforts every day.

This was challenging for the team. It required much effort, discussion and a pause for prayer. In the end we were led to the following: the Mission Statement of Faith Lutheran Church is:
