



OLD TESTAMENT

Isaiah 6:1-13

In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of his robe filled the temple. Above him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. And one called to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory!" And the foundations of the thresholds shook at the voice of him who called, and the house was filled with smoke. And I said: "Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!" Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a burning coal that he had taken with tongs from the altar. And he touched my mouth and said: "Behold, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away, and your sin atoned for." And though a tenth remain in it, it will be burned again, like a terebinth or an oak, whose stump remains when it is felled."The holy seed is its stump.

Luke 5: 1-11


P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the fifth chapter.






All men are invited to our monthly Prayer Breakfast at 9:00 a.m. this Monday in the fellowship hall.

the prophet Nathan confronted David about his sin of adultery with Bathsheba and the murder of her husband by telling him a parable. After hearing the parable, David became angry and said the man in it should die, and make restitution "fourfold." It turned out David was the man in the parable, and the "fourfold" restitution he "prophesied" about himself sadly came true. For the one man he had killed (Bathsheba's husband), he later had 4 sons die: (2 Sam 12:15-19)(2 Sam 13:28-33)(2 Sam 18:14-15)(1 Kin 2:23-25).

First promise in the Bible: (Gen 2:17) "But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die."

Last promise in the Bible: (Rev 22:20) "He which testifieth these things saith, Surely I come quickly. Amen. Even so, come, Lord Jesus." The book of John contains no parables.

The only time in the synoptic Gospels (Mt, Mk, Lk) where John the disciple spoke is in (Mk 9:38) "And John answered him, saying, Master, we saw one casting out devils in thy name, and he followeth not us: and we forbad him, because he followeth not us." (Also see: Lk 9:49) 42 youth were mauled by 2 female bears because they made fun of Elisha's bald head (2 Kin 2:23-24).

Last Tuesday – The Purpose Statement – purpose statements are designed to give a robust description of the congregation's reason for existing. It is also a way to describe our understanding of God's purpose for placing us in this place, at this time, with these people (Acts 17:26, 27). A <u>purpose statement</u> is typically for internal use, to serve as a filter to guide our activities, to identify boundaries and to keep us focused on what we're here to do. The team gathered in the Fellowship Hall working on this, spent much time and effort discerning what to do with the resources God has invested in us, identifying the people He has given us to serve, our overriding passion, our identity and how best to bring this all together in a single purpose statement that best reflects who we are. Below is the purpose statement that was the result of their efforts, which will be used going forward.

Faith Lutheran Church exists to honor and glorify God through prayer, preaching, teaching, building relationships in a welcoming space, and actively engaging in ministry in our community and the world. Our faith is confessed in the one true God – Father, Son and Holy Spirit – and celebrated in the Sacraments according to the confessional standards of The Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod.
